Most of us experience loneliness at one point in our lives.


If that loneliness stretches over time - it becomes dangerous.

AV1 The world's first Telepresence robot for children with long-term illness



AV1 is remote controlled by a child who is unable to participate.

For these kids AV1 becomes their eyes, ears and voice.

Designed for and with the user group

- No screen (two-way audio, one-way video)
 - Bedridden kids, often undergoing treatment
- A "blank slate"

AV1 can be decorated and made personal

Boring name

The kids name their robot themselves

Portabel, but stationary

Six hours battery time lets you go on fieldtrips

One fourth of those above 80 frequently spend days without talking to anyone.




Amongst the seniors, especially three factors increases loneliness

- Their own expectations




Few seniors are leveraging technology

"Leathery fingers" = dry fingertips




"I don't want anything"
